Lots of construction news -> 45 moves to do; 4<sup>th</sup> is staying but 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> will move in new construction space for fall school year; when they move back, the rooms will be renovated including the bathrooms; cafeteria will be able to feed 3 classes at a time which has some impact to consolidate lunch times; start at 11:15am so closer to typical lunchtime and still run to 1pm; Kindergarten looks like everyone is going to get their choice and won't have to do a lottery

March is Read Across America; a lot of book buddies and getting big kids working with little kids

One of the major initiatives is practicing emergency drills; everyone will be getting email; finished brochure on off-site evacuation with bussing to a third party unification site and then home; doesn't have to be an active shooter but an unexpected issue; kids have practiced doing evacuation to safety complex; On April 14<sup>th</sup>, we will be doing a practice run to safety complex and then 2<sup>nd</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> will be bussed from there to Assembly of God church where there is a plan for reunification to practice; they will go through plan to work out kinks and then be bussed back to the school and return to class

## SCHOOL BOARD UPDATE

Has four goals for this year and are doing well with all

 School construction is on target; framework structure is 95% complete; next benchmark is 4/15 when it should be weather tight; due to be finished in August 16<sup>th</sup> and available for fall; starting full day kindergarten in fall 2020

- 2. Targeted curriculum, steam, language and health middle school; training teachers and bringing them up through each grade
- 3. Affective use of school district resources and doing best to maximize schedule as much as they can; UA and Pinkerton distance learning
- 4. Advance and mature new student success framework; next meeting will receive a schedule from different standardized tests and which grades take them; some take every year and some certain grades; currently have 3 different kids of standardized tests; how do we take feedback from these and change teaching methods and curriculum to best help students and challenge them

3 articles on March ballot: electing new board members, budget, putting money in school construction fund from surplus if it passes

Constantly short of a few paraprofessionals if anyone knows someone who wants to help out or is looking for a position

Communications with Pinkerton is improving; just received a newsletter about strategic planning, Dr. Collins received report cards for students there to see how they are acclimating

- Remodeling the teachers room will be done over February break; new cabinet in STEAM is done; since these were not part of the construction, Dr. Collins and Scott Dube wanted to work on these areas
